



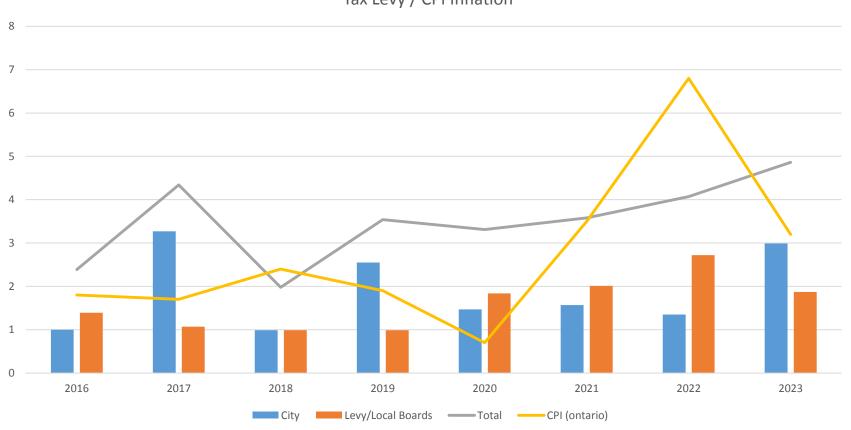

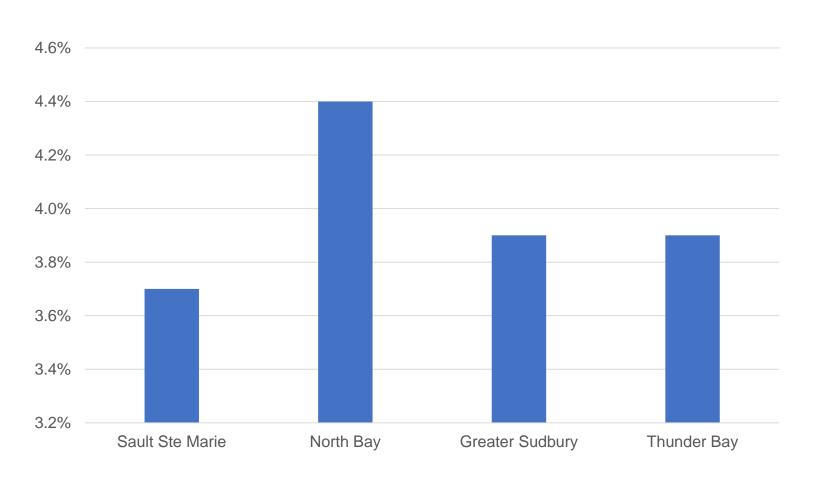
Inflation

Challenges

- Municipal funding framework
- Asset Condition and Infrastructure Deficit

Financial Options for Council Consideration

- Increase City share of the tax levy to 2023 level of 2.99%
- Phase out 2023 tax stabilization reserve
- John Rhodes Community Centre capital request funded from retired debt servicing



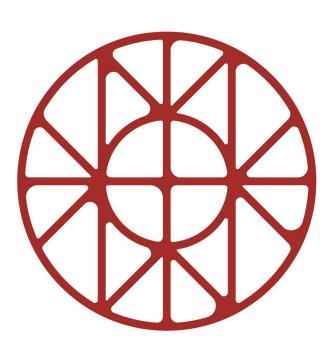
2024 Proposed Budget

- \$215.6 million Operating Budget
 - Includes costs for delivering municipal services and outside boards
- \$41.1 million Capital Budget
- Tabled draft budget is a 7.17% property levy increase



Budgetary Pressures

- Contractual increases / inflationary pressures
- Capital investment requirements
- New or enhanced services approved by Council
- Insurance
- Service partners





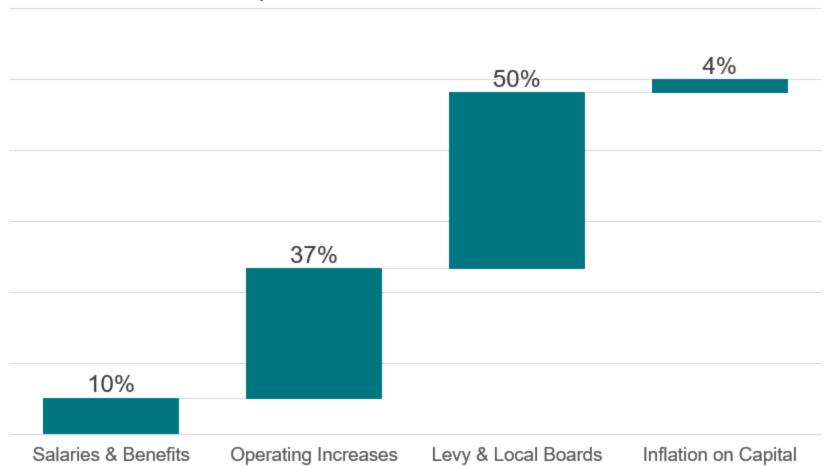
Municipal Levy (millions)

Revenue Source	Percentage of Total
Miscellaneous taxation not included in levy	10%
User fees	47%
Government grants	29%
Investment income	9%

Total	\$2,929

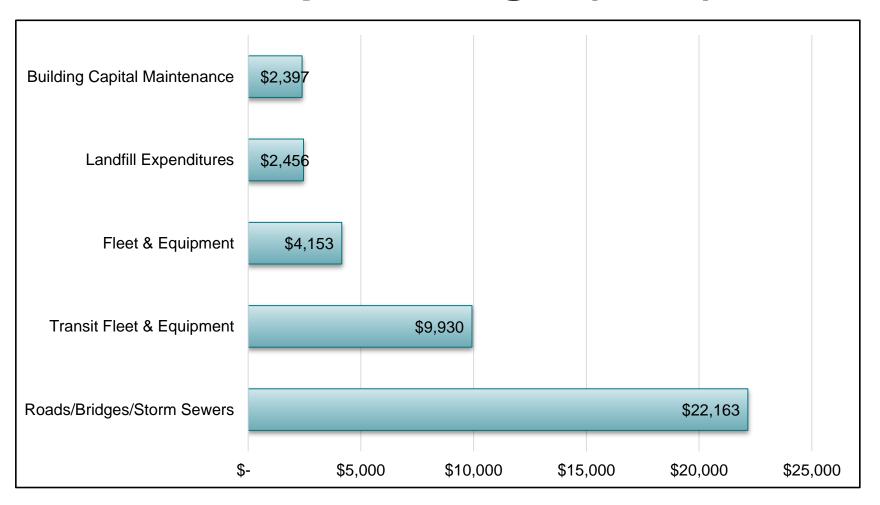


2024 Capital Highlights

- Capital Program totaling \$41.1 million
- Significant amount of road work over one-half of the capital budget
- Substantial asset renewal work in other asset categories (Transit, Fleet, Landfill, etc.)
- Utilizing \$16 million in funding from senior levels of government (CCBF, OCIF, Connecting Link, NORDS, etc.)

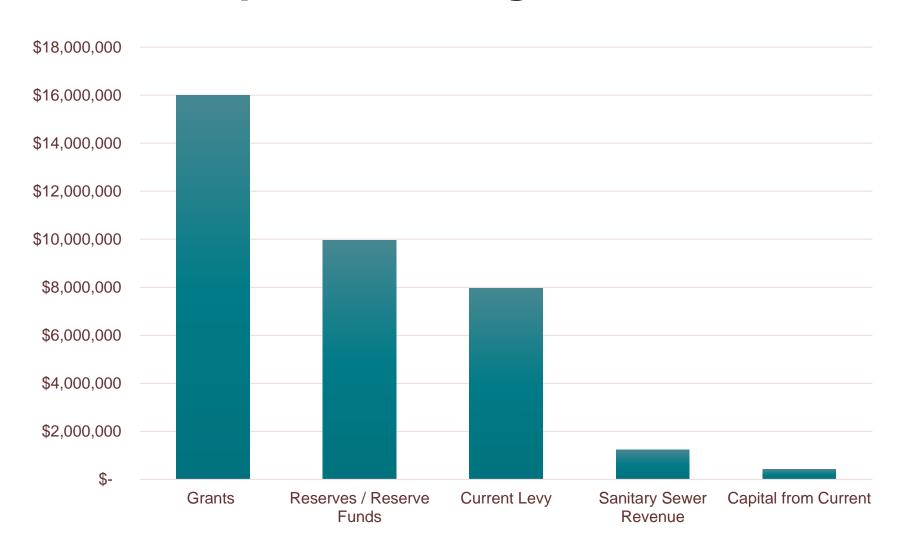


2024 Capital Budget (\$000)

2025 Capital Forecast

- Anticipated annual capital spend of \$156 million projected for the next four years
- Assumed consistent capital revenues with attempts to maximize external funding
- Large projects potentially requiring debt Biosolids, West End Plant (Phase 2), and GFL roof replacement
- Will continue to evolve as Asset Management plans and other guiding documents improve



Supplementary Requests

- Total of 30 requests to enhance services
- \$2.8 million (2024 Impact)
- Funding strategies identified for three requests (JRCC roof replacement, Fire pumper, and NG-911 CAD system)



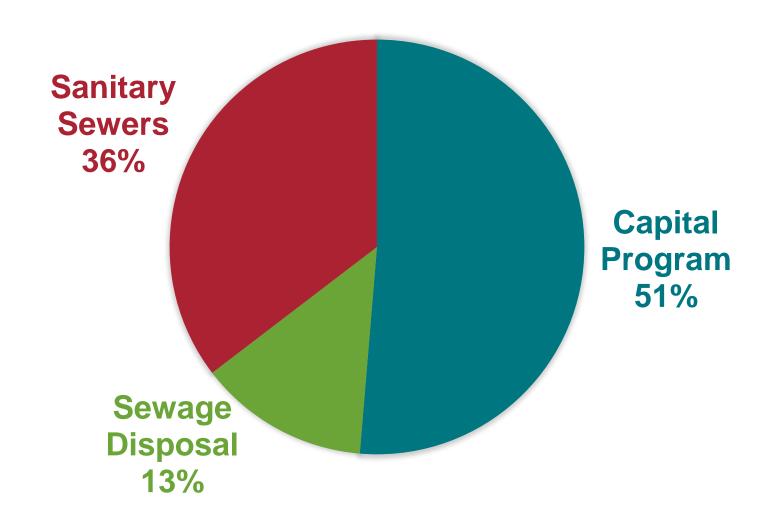


Sanitary Budget

- 100% user-pay
- Operating portion maintains current services and service levels
- Capital budget funds treatment plants, biosolids, pump stations, linear infrastructure, etc.
